CALL FOR PAPERS

Following the four successful events (WCSB 2003 - 2006) hosted by Tampere University of Technology (TUT), Finland, and the fifth WCSB event (WCSB 2008) hosted by the University of Leipzig, Germany, the next WCSB event will take place at Aarhus University (AU) in June 2009.

WCSB aims at bringing together the various communities involved in the different aspects of computational systems biology research, e.g. experimental biology, machine learning, signal processing, mathematics, statistics, and theoretical physics. The scientific program includes invited plenary talks as well as regular sessions with contributed research talks and posters.

The papers of no more than four pages, including results, figures and references, will then be further refereed for minor corrections.
